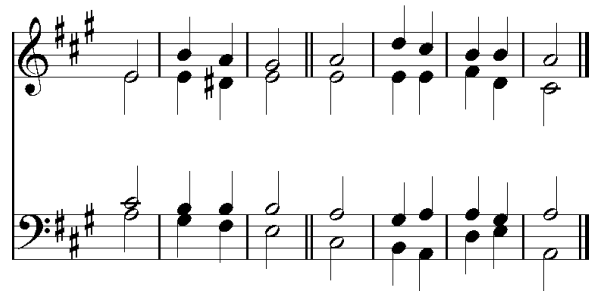
All stand. The Officiant begins with the opening sentences.

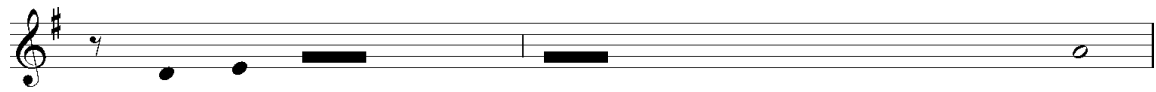
- 1 O come, let us <sup>sing</sup> unto the <sup>Lord</sup>; \*

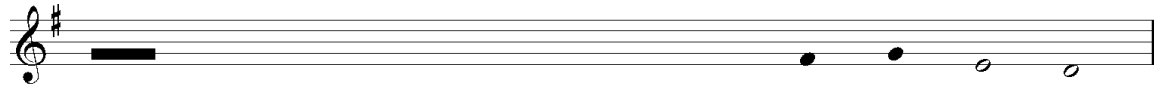

and <sup>will</sup> be for <sup>ever</sup>. A<sup>men</sup>. [Ant.]



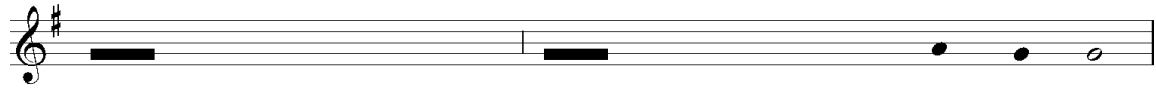
- 1 *Protect* me, O God, for I take refuge in yóu; \*

and in your right hand are plea/sures for évermore. [Ant.]



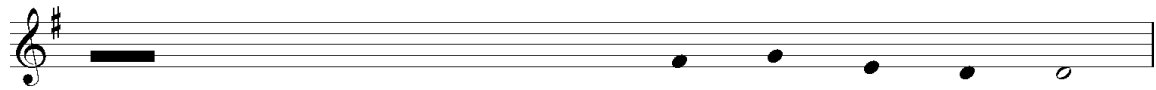
